After releasing the Project's Scoping Report, we have since been issued with the project's SEARS, which is the Planning Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements.



The SEARS outlines the general and technical assessment requirements for the project's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

As part of the EIS, we will be carrying out assessments on the local landscape and identifying any visual impacts. We'll also undertake assessments to understand noise and vibration, biodiversity, heritage, transport, water and soils, air quality, hazards and risks, waste, and social and economic impacts and benefits of the project.

While we undertake these studies for the EIS, the local community and other key stakeholders will be consulted for their input on the project through meetings and further community information sessions.


The outcome of our ongoing consultation and assessments will inform the final plans for our proposed development, and we welcome your ongoing feedback on our proposal.
