The work continues across solar farm in 2023

It's full steam ahead on site at the New England Solar project with crews continuing their work installing piles, trackers, solar panels and the installation and connection of the power conversion units.

Around 450 workers are on site each day installing up to 5,000 solar panels as well as completing other installation and labouring tasks.

The project hit an important milestone just prior to Christmas last year when it generated its first five megawatts of clean renewable energy.

It followed the successful commissioning of the onsite substation and TransGrid's switching station, which connects the solar project to the electricity transmission network and formal registration to send power into the National Electricity Market (NEM) by the Australian Energy Market Organisation (AEMO).

Commissioning activity and testing is continuing, to allow energy generation to ramp up over the coming months.
