Progress on Robbins Island DA

We've spent the past few months revising the Robbins Island Renewable Energy Park development application addressing the feedback provided by the Circular Head Council, the Tasmanian Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and the Commonwealth Department of Agriculture, Water and Environment (DAWE). The development application is now ready to be resubmitted for assessment. We don't have any say on when the development

application will be put on public display, but we anticipate it's still at least a couple of months away.

Once we have been informed of the when the public exhibition period is approaching, we will let you know. In the meantime, we ask for your patience. All the technical reports addressing the issues that are potentially of concern to the community will be available with the development application.



The surveys along the transmission line route have been completed and the development applications for the Circular Head, Waratah-Wynyard and Burnie councils are almost complete.

We expect the development applications to be lodged for assessment in the next few weeks. This will mark the beginning of the assessment process which will also involve the EPA and DAWE. It will be many months until the transmission line development applications will be ready for public exhibition.
