



Timeline and Approvals

The Aquila Wind project has been in development since 2022, and is being assessed as a State Significant Development under Part 4 of the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

The NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) is the state planning authority for the project, and under this process, we have prepared a number of reports, including a preliminary environmental and social assessment as part of the Project's Scoping Report.

DPHI has accepted the Scoping Report and issued its assessment guidelines known as the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs).

A wide range of studies and assessments are currently being undertaken as part of the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the project. These include assessments of noise, visual and landscape, biodiversity, cultural heritage, traffic and transport, social, economic, and cumulative impacts.

The outcome of our ongoing consultation and assessments will inform the final plans for the proposed development. We want our Aquila Wind project to be a valued and long-term part of the local community for decades to come.
