Timeline and Approvals

The Aquila Wind project is in the early stages of planning and will be assessed as a State Significant Development under Part 4 of the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

The NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) is the state planning authority for the project, and under this process, we will prepare a number of reports, including a preliminary environmental and social assessment. DPHI will then issue project specific assessment requirements that will include an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

This comprehensive set of reports will include environmental, social and technical surveys, and will outline consultation carried out with Aboriginal representatives and communities.

The outcome of this consultation and assessment will inform the final plans for the proposed development.

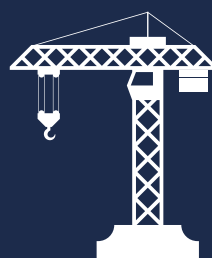
